

The following are the 613 commandments and their source in scripture,  
as enumerated by Maimonides:

351	Deut 12.17	Not to eat the tithes at home	You may not eat within your gates the tithe of your grain or your new wine or your oil, of the firstborn of your herd or your flock, of any of your offerings which you vow, of your freewill offerings, or of the heave offering of your hand.
352	Lev 6.18	Carry out the procedure of the sin offering	All the males among the children of Aaron may eat it. [It shall be] a statute forever in your generations concerning the offerings made by fire to the LORD. Everyone who touches them must be holy.
353	Lev 6.23	Not to eat the meat of the inner sin offering	For every grain offering for the priest shall be wholly burned. It shall not be eaten."
354	Lev 5.8	Not to decapitate a fowl brought as a sin offering	And he shall bring them to the priest, who shall offer [that] which [is] for the sin offering first, and wring off its head from its neck, but shall not divide [it] completely.
355	Lev 7.1	Carry out the procedure of the guilt offering	'Likewise this is the law of the trespass offering (it is most holy):
356	Ex 29.32	The Kohanim must eat the sacrificial meat in the Temple	Then Aaron and his sons shall eat the flesh of the ram, and the bread that [is] in the basket, [by] the door of the tabernacle of meeting.
357	Deut 12.17	The Kohanim must not eat the meat outside the Temple courtyard	You may not eat within your gates the tithe of your grain or your new wine or your oil, of the firstborn of your herd or your flock, of any of your offerings which you vow, of your freewill offerings, or of the heave offering of your hand.
358	Ex 29.33	A non-Kohen must not eat sacrificial meat	They shall eat those things with which the atonement was made, to consecrate [and] to sanctify them; but an outsider shall not eat [them], because they [are] holy.
359	Lev 7.11	To follow the procedure of the peace offering	'This [is] the law of the sacrifice of peace offerings which he shall offer to the LORD:
360	Deut 12.16	Not to eat the meat of minor sacrifices before sprinkling the blood	Only you shall not eat the blood; you shall pour it on the earth like water.
361	Lev 2.1	To bring meal offerings as prescribed in the Torah	'When anyone offers a grain offering to the LORD, his offering shall be of fine flour. And he shall pour oil on it, and put frankincense on it.
362	Lev 5.11	Not to put oil on the meal offerings of wrongdoers	'But if he is not able to bring two turtledoves or two young pigeons, then he who sinned shall bring for his offering one-tenth of an ephah of fine flour as a sin offering. He shall put no oil on it, nor shall he put frankincense on it, for it [is] a sin offering.

363	Lev 5.11	Not to put frankincense on the meal offerings of wrongdoers	'But if he is not able to bring two turtledoves or two young pigeons, then he who sinned shall bring for his offering one-tenth of an ephah of fine flour as a sin offering. He shall put no oil on it, nor shall he put frankincense on it, for it [is] a sin offering.
364	Lev 6.16	Not to eat the meal offering of the High Priest	And the remainder of it Aaron and his sons shall eat; with unleavened bread it shall be eaten in a holy place; in the court of the tabernacle of meeting they shall eat it.
365	Lev 6.16	Not to bake a meal offering as leavened bread	And the remainder of it Aaron and his sons shall eat; with unleavened bread it shall be eaten in a holy place; in the court of the tabernacle of meeting they shall eat it.
366	Lev 6.16	The Kohanim must eat the remains of the meal offerings	And the remainder of it Aaron and his sons shall eat; with unleavened bread it shall be eaten in a holy place; in the court of the tabernacle of meeting they shall eat it.
367	Deut 12.5-6	To bring all avowed and freewill offerings to the Temple on the first subsequent festival	"But you shall seek the place where the LORD your God chooses, out of all your tribes, to put His name for His dwelling place; and there you shall go. There you shall take your burnt offerings, your sacrifices, your tithes, the heave offerings of your hand, your vowed offerings, your freewill offerings, and the firstborn of your herds and flocks.
368	Deut 23.22	Not to withhold payment incurred by any vow	"When you make a vow to the LORD your God, you shall not delay to pay it; for the LORD your God will surely require it of you, and it would be sin to you.
369	Deut 12.11	To offer all sacrifices in the Temple	then there will be the place where the LORD your God chooses to make His name abide. There you shall bring all that I command you: your burnt offerings, your sacrifices, your tithes, the heave offerings of your hand, and all your choice offerings which you vow to the LORD.
370	Deut 12.26	To bring all sacrifices from outside Israel to the Temple	(from v21) Only the holy things which you have, and your vowed offerings, you shall take and go to the place which the LORD chooses.
371	Lev 17.11	Not to slaughter sacrifices outside the courtyard	For the life of the flesh [is] in the blood, and I have given it to you upon the altar to make atonement for your souls; for it [is] the blood [that] makes atonement for the soul.'
372	Deut 12.13	Not to offer any sacrifices outside the courtyard	Take heed to yourself that you do not offer your burnt offerings in every place that you see;

373	Num 28.3	To offer two lambs every day	"And you shall say to them, 'This [is] the offering made by fire which you shall offer to the LORD: two male lambs in their first year without blemish, day by day, as a regular burnt offering.
374	Lev 6.12	To light a fire on the altar every day	And the fire on the altar shall be kept burning on it; it shall not be put out. And the priest shall burn wood on it every morning, and lay the burnt offering in order on it; and he shall burn on it the fat of the peace offerings.
375	Lev 6.13	Not to extinguish this fire	A fire shall always be burning on the altar; it shall never go out.
