

The following are the 613 commandments and their source in scripture,
as enumerated by Maimonides:

501	Lev 25.17	Not to insult or harm anybody with words	Therefore you shall not oppress one another, but you shall fear your God; for I [am] the LORD your God.
502	Ex 22.21	Not to cheat a convert monetarily	"You shall neither mistreat a stranger nor oppress him, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt.
503	Ex 22.21	Not to insult or harm a convert with words	"You shall neither mistreat a stranger nor oppress him, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt.
504	Ex 21.2	Purchase a Hebrew slave in accordance with the prescribed laws	If you buy a Hebrew servant, he shall serve six years; and in the seventh he shall go out free and pay nothing.
505	Lev 25.42	Not to sell him as a slave is sold	For they [are] My servants, whom I brought out of the land of Egypt; they shall not be sold as slaves.
506	Lev 25.43	Not to work him oppressively	You shall not rule over him with rigor, but you shall fear your God.
507	Lev 25.53	Not to allow a non-Jew to work him oppressively	He shall be with him as a yearly hired servant, and he shall not rule with rigor over him in your sight.
508	Lev 25.39	Not to have him do menial slave labor	'And if [one of] your brethren [who dwells] by you becomes poor, and sells himself to you, you shall not compel him to serve as a slave.
509	Deut 15.14	Give him gifts when he goes free	you shall supply him liberally from your flock, from your threshing floor, and from your winepress. [From what] the LORD has blessed you with, you shall give to him.
510	Deut 15.13	Not to send him away empty-handed	And when you send him away free from you, you shall not let him go away empty-handed;
511	Ex 21.8	Redeem Jewish maidservants	If she does not please her master, who has betrothed her to himself, then he shall let her be redeemed. He shall have no right to sell her to a foreign people, since he has dealt deceitfully with her.
512	Ex 21.8	Betroth the Jewish maidservant	If she does not please her master, who has betrothed her to himself, then he shall let her be redeemed. He shall have no right to sell her to a foreign people, since he has dealt deceitfully with her.
513	Ex 21.8	The master must not sell his maidservant	If she does not please her master, who has betrothed her to himself, then he shall let her be redeemed. He shall have no right to sell her to a foreign people, since he has dealt deceitfully with her.

514	Lev 25.46	Canaanite slaves must work forever unless injured in one of their limbs	And you may take them as an inheritance for your children after you, to inherit [them as] a possession; they shall be your permanent slaves. But regarding your brethren, the children of Israel, you shall not rule over one another with rigor.
515	Deut 23.15	Not to extradite a slave who fled to (Biblical) Israel	"You shall not give back to his master the slave who has escaped from his master to you.
516	Deut 23.16	Not to wrong a slave who has come to Israel for refuge	He may dwell with you in your midst, in the place which he chooses within one of your gates, where it seems best to him; you shall not oppress him.
517	Ex 22.9	The courts must carry out the laws of a hired worker and hired guard	"For any kind of trespass, [whether it concerns] an ox, a donkey, a sheep, or clothing, [or] for any kind of lost thing which [another] claims to be his, the cause of both parties shall come before the judges; [and] whomever the judges condemn shall pay double to his neighbor.
518	Deut 24.15	Pay wages on the day they were earned	Each day you shall give [him] his wages, and not let the sun go down on it, for he [is] poor and has set his heart on it; lest he cry out against you to the LORD, and it be sin to you.
519	Lev 19.13	Not to delay payment of wages past the agreed time	"You shall not cheat your neighbor, nor rob [him]. The wages of him who is hired shall not remain with you all night until morning.
520	Deut 23.24	The hired worker may eat from the unharvested crops where he works	"When you come into your neighbor's vineyard, you may eat your fill of grapes at your pleasure, but you shall not put [any] in your container.
521	Deut 23.25	The worker must not eat while on hired time	When you come into your neighbor's standing grain, you may pluck the heads with your hand, but you shall not use a sickle on your neighbor's standing grain.
522	Deut 23.24	The worker must not take more than he can eat Deut.	"When you come into your neighbor's vineyard, you may eat your fill of grapes at your pleasure, but you shall not put [any] in your container.
523	Deut 25.4	Not to muzzle an ox while plowing	"You shall not muzzle an ox while it treads out [the grain].
524	Ex 22.13	The courts must carry out the laws of a borrower	If it is torn to pieces [by a beast, then] he shall bring it as evidence, [and] he shall not make good what was torn.
525	Ex 22.6	The courts must carry out the laws of an unpaid guard	"If fire breaks out and catches in thorns, so that stacked grain, standing grain, or the field is consumed, he who kindled the fire shall surely make restitution.
