

The following are the 613 commandments and their source in scripture,
as enumerated by Maimonides:

526	Ex 22.25	Lend to the poor and destitute	"If you lend money to [any of] My people [who are] poor among you, you shall not be like a moneylender to him; you shall not charge him interest.
527	Ex 22.26	Not to press them for payment if you know they don't have it	If you ever take your neighbor's garment as a pledge, you shall return it to him before the sun goes down.
528	Deut 15.3	Press the idolater for payment	Of a foreigner you may require it; but you shall give up your claim to what is owed by your brother,
529	Deut 24.10	The creditor must not forcibly take collateral	"When you lend your brother anything, you shall not go into his house to get his pledge.
530	Deut 24.13	Return the collateral to the debtor when needed	You shall in any case return the pledge to him again when the sun goes down, that he may sleep in his own garment and bless you; and it shall be righteousness to you before the LORD your God.
531	Deut 24.12	Not to delay its return when needed	And if the man [is] poor, you shall not keep his pledge overnight.
532	Deut 24.17	Not to demand collateral from a widow	"You shall not pervert justice due the stranger or the fatherless, nor take a widow's garment as a pledge.
533	Deut 24.6	Not to demand as collateral utensils needed for preparing food	"No man shall take the lower or the upper millstone in pledge, for he takes [one's] living in pledge.
534	Lev 25.37	Not to lend with interest	You shall not lend him your money for usury, nor lend him your food at a profit.
535	Deut 23.19	Not to borrow with interest	"You shall not charge interest to your brother--interest on money [or] food [or] anything that is lent out at interest.
536	Ex 22.25	Not to intermediate in an interest loan, guarantee, witness, or write the promissory note	"If you lend money to [any of] My people [who are] poor among you, you shall not be like a moneylender to him; you shall not charge him interest.
537	Deut 23.20	Lend to and borrow from idolaters with interest	To a foreigner you may charge interest, but to your brother you shall not charge interest, that the LORD your God may bless you in all to which you set your hand in the land which you are entering to possess.
538	Ex 22.8	The courts must carry out the laws of the plaintiff, admitter, or denier	If the thief is not found, then the master of the house shall be brought to the judges [to see] whether he has put his hand into his neighbor's goods.
539	Num 27.8	Carry out the laws of the order of inheritance	And you shall speak to the children of Israel, saying: 'If a man dies and has no son, then you shall cause his inheritance to pass to his daughter.

540	Deut 16.18	Appoint judges	"You shall appoint judges and officers in all your gates, which the LORD your God gives you, according to your tribes, and they shall judge the people with just judgment.
541	Deut 1.15	Not to appoint judges who are not familiar with judicial procedure	So I took the heads of your tribes, wise and knowledgeable men, and made them heads over you, leaders of thousands, leaders of hundreds, leaders of fifties, leaders of tens, and officers for your tribes.
542	Ex 23.2	Decide by majority in case of disagreement	You shall not follow a crowd to do evil; nor shall you testify in a dispute so as to turn aside after many to pervert justice.
543	Ex 23.2	The court must not execute through a majority of one; at least a majority of two is required	You shall not follow a crowd to do evil; nor shall you testify in a dispute so as to turn aside after many to pervert justice.
544	Deut 16.19	A judge who presented an acquittal plea must not present an argument for conviction in capital cases	Thou shalt not wrest judgment; thou shalt not respect persons, neither take a gift: for a gift doth blind the eyes of the wise, and pervert the words of the righteous.
545	Deut 22.24	The courts must carry out the death penalty of stoning	then you shall bring them both out to the gate of that city, and you shall stone them to death with stones, the young woman because she did not cry out in the city, and the man because he humbled his neighbor's wife; so you shall put away the evil from among you.
546	Lev 20.14	The courts must carry out the death penalty of burning	If a man marries a woman and her mother, it [is] wickedness. They shall be burned with fire, both he and they, that there may be no wickedness among you.
547	Ex 21.20	The courts must carry out the death penalty of the sword	"And if a man beats his male or female servant with a rod, so that he dies under his hand, he shall surely be punished.
548	Lev 20.10	The courts must carry out the death penalty of strangulation	"The man who commits adultery with [another] man's wife, [he] who commits adultery with his neighbor's wife, the adulterer and the adulteress, shall surely be put to death.
549	Deut 21.22	The courts must hang those stoned for blasphemy or idolatry	"If a man has committed a sin deserving of death, and he is put to death, and you hang him on a tree,
550	Deut 21.23	Bury the executed on the day they are killed	his body shall not remain overnight on the tree, but you shall surely bury him that day, so that you do not defile the land which the LORD your God is giving you [as] an inheritance; for he who is hanged [is] accursed of God.
