

The following are the 613 commandments and their source in scripture,
as enumerated by Maimonides:

601	Deut 17.16	Not to dwell permanently in Egypt	But he shall not multiply horses for himself, nor cause the people to return to Egypt to multiply horses, for the LORD has said to you, 'You shall not return that way again.'
602	Deut 20.10	Offer peace terms to the inhabitants of a city while holding siege, and treat them according to the Torah if they accept the terms	"When you go near a city to fight against it, then proclaim an offer of peace to it.
603	Deut 23.6	Not to offer peace to Ammon and Moab while besieging them	You shall not seek their peace nor their prosperity all your days forever.
604	Deut 20.19	Not to destroy fruit trees even during the siege	"When you besiege a city for a long time, while making war against it to take it, you shall not destroy its trees by wielding an ax against them; if you can eat of them, do not cut them down to use in the siege, for the tree of the field [is] man's [food].
605	Deut 23.12	Prepare latrines outside the camps	"Also you shall have a place outside the camp, where you may go out;
606	Deut 23.13	Prepare a shovel for each soldier to dig with	and you shall have an implement among your equipment, and when you sit down outside, you shall dig with it and turn and cover your refuse.
607	Deut 20.2	Appoint a priest to speak with the soldiers during the war	So it shall be, when you are on the verge of battle, that the priest shall approach and speak to the people.
608	Deut 24.5	He who has taken a wife, built a new home, or planted a vineyard is given a year to rejoice with his possessions	"When a man has taken a new wife, he shall not go out to war or be charged with any business; he shall be free at home one year, and bring happiness to his wife whom he has taken.
609	Deut 24.5	Not to demand from the above any involvement, communal or military	"When a man has taken a new wife, he shall not go out to war or be charged with any business; he shall be free at home one year, and bring happiness to his wife whom he has taken.
610	Deut 20.3	Not to panic and retreat during battle	And he shall say to them, 'Hear, O Israel: Today you are on the verge of battle with your enemies. Do not let your heart faint, do not be afraid, and do not tremble or be terrified because of them;
611	Deut 21.11	Keep the laws of the captive woman	and you see among the captives a beautiful woman, and desire her and would take her for your wife,
612	Deut 21.14	Not to sell her into slavery	And it shall be, if you have no delight in her, then you shall set her free, but you certainly shall not sell her for money; you shall not treat her brutally, because you have humbled her.

613 Deut 21.14 Not to retain her for servitude after having sexual relations with her
