

The following are the 613 commandments and their source in scripture,
as enumerated by Maimonides:

76	Deut 6.7	To say the Shema twice daily	You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, when you walk by the way, when you lie down, and when you rise up.
77	Ex 23.25	To serve the Almighty with daily prayer	"So you shall serve the LORD your God, and He will bless your bread and your water. And I will take sickness away from the midst of you.
78	Num 6.23	The <i>Kohanim</i> must bless the Jewish nation daily	"Speak to Aaron and his sons, saying, 'This is the way you shall bless the children of Israel. Say to them:
79	Deut 6.8	To wear <i>tefillin</i> (phylacteries) on the head	You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes.
80	Deut 6.8	To bind tefillin on the arm	You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes.
81	Deut 6.9	To put a <i>mezuzah</i> on each door post	You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates.
82	Deut 31.19	Each male must write a Torah scroll	"Now therefore, write down this song for yourselves, and teach it to the children of Israel; put it in their mouths, that this song may be a witness for Me against the children of Israel.
83	Deut 17.18	The king must have a separate Sefer Torah for himself	"Also it shall be, when he sits on the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write for himself a copy of this law in a book, from [the one] before the priests, the Levites.
84	Num 15.38	To have <i>tzitzit</i> on four-cornered garments	"Speak to the children of Israel: Tell them to make tassels on the corners of their garments throughout their generations, and to put a blue thread in the tassels of the corners.
85	Deut 8.10	To bless the Almighty after eating	When you have eaten and are full, then you shall bless the LORD your God for the good land which He has given you.
86	Lev 12.3	To circumcise all males on the eighth day after their birth	And on the eighth day the flesh of his foreskin shall be circumcised.
87	Ex 23.12	To rest on the seventh day	Six days you shall do your work, and on the seventh day you shall rest, that your ox and your donkey may rest, and the son of your female servant and the stranger may be refreshed.

88	Ex 20.10	Not to do prohibited labor on the seventh day	but the seventh day is the Sabbath of the LORD your God. In it you shall do no work: you, nor your son, nor your daughter, nor your male servant, nor your female servant, nor your cattle, nor your stranger who is within your gates.
89	Ex 35.3	The court must not inflict punishment on Shabbat	You shall kindle no fire throughout your dwellings on the Sabbath day."
90	Ex 16.29	Not to walk outside the city boundary on Shabbat	See! For the LORD has given you the Sabbath; therefore He gives you on the sixth day bread for two days. Let every man remain in his place; let no man go out of his place on the seventh day."
91	Ex 20.8	To sanctify the day with <i>Kiddush</i> and <i>Havdalah</i>	"Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy.
92	Lev 23.32	To rest from prohibited labor	It [shall be] to you a sabbath of [solemn] rest, and you shall afflict your souls; on the ninth [day] of the month at evening, from evening to evening, you shall celebrate your sabbath."
93	Lev 23.32	Not to do prohibited labor on Yom Kippur	It [shall be] to you a sabbath of [solemn] rest, and you shall afflict your souls; on the ninth [day] of the month at evening, from evening to evening, you shall celebrate your sabbath."
94	Lev 16.29	To afflict yourself on Yom Kippur	"[This] shall be a statute forever for you: In the seventh month, on the tenth [day] of the month, you shall afflict your souls, and do no work at all, [whether] a native of your own country or a stranger who dwells among you.
95	Lev 23.29	Not to eat or drink on Yom Kippur	For any person who is not afflicted [in soul] on that same day shall be cut off from his people.
96	Lev 23.7	To rest on the first day of Passover	On the first day you shall have a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work on it.
97	Lev 23.8	Not to do prohibited labor on the first day of Passover	But you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD for seven days. The seventh day [shall be] a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work [on it].' "
98	Lev 23.8	To rest on the seventh day of Passover	But you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD for seven days. The seventh day [shall be] a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work [on it].' "
99	Lev 23.8	Not to do prohibited labor on the seventh day of Passover	But you shall offer an offering made by fire to the LORD for seven days. The seventh day [shall be] a holy convocation; you shall do no customary work [on it].' "
